

# Is the GBVIMS right for your Organization?

For organizations providing direct services to survivors of GBV, the use of the GBV Information Management System (GBVIMS) has clear benefits: **quality data that protects clients**. Feedback from current GBVIMS users affirms this:

**The GBVIMS will strengthen your GBV programming** by allowing service providers to:

- Protect client confidentiality and ensure clients maintain control of their information
- Use aggregate anonymous data to inform programming, advocacy efforts, donor reporting and proposal development
- Compare statistics on gender-based violence within your organization, with other GBV service providing organizations and across contexts
- Provide a mechanism for organizations to practice higher standards for data collection
- Contribute standardized and actionable information to GBV coordination bodies which support their work

The more organizations that join the UNFPA, IRC, UNHCR, and UNICEF in utilizing and promoting the GBVIMS, the more it will **help generate new norms that protect clients and produce the highest quality data available to date**.
